Double Exposure Jacket

Page 77, Line 10: Work in DK ribbing as established, but place markers to prepare for Double Knitting as follows: FB, pm, (now, this is the change) work 9 pairs (the book incorrectly says 12).

Central Park Coat (changes shown in red)

Page 139: Using 29" circular needle two strands of color A together, cast on 210 sts. Turn.

Set-up Row: Loosely tie on color B and cut off one of the color A strands. Sl 1 single stitch. *Byb, k1 with color B, byf, p1 with color A. Repeat from * until a single stitch remains, using color A only, k1. You have 1 edge st, 209 DSPs, and 1 edge st. This sets up the Closed Edge Stitches (CESs) at both edges of the coat (see *Edge Stitches* on page 14). This is Row 1 of the chart.

Note: For the rest of this pattern, CES (Closed Edge Stitch) means:

- at the beginning of each row, sl 1 single stitch p'wise, pick up color B and twist yarns to prevent hole, continue.

- at the end of each row, drop color B on the side of your work closest to you and, using color A only, knit thelast single stitch.

Row 2: Begin following the chart (begin with row 2) as follows: CES, DK following chart to Pivot Stitch, read chart from left to right (repeating pattern back to beginning), CES. Turn.

Rows 3-188: Continue as established, following charts.
