Page 5 should read:


Perhaps the most thoughtful definition of lace came from Rosemary Shepherd's paper "Lace Classification System" written for the Powerhouse Museum in Sydney. The definition that Shepherd arrives at is "lace as a decorative openwork fabric in which the pattern of spaces is as important as the solid areas." Shepherd goes on to note that this definition "was written from the point of view of a maker of lace as well as a lace historian, with the expectation that lacemaking will continue to evolve, possibly beyond any techniques we might currently conceive of."



Page 160 FIREBUSH:

Row 1 LS DC: k2, brp1, sl1yo, p1, sl1yo¹, p1, sl1yo, brp1, k2. Turn.

On the **REPEAT FIREBUSH CHART - RIGHT SIDE OF SHAWL AND LEFT SIDE OF THE SHAWL** one symbol, brk1, is missing at the beginning and end of Row 13 LS LC.





Page 179, **Tubular Row 2 LS LC:** should read: k1, *sl1wyif, k1; rep from *. Do not turn; slide.

Page 195 Woollenflower was misspelled

Page 201: **GAUGE** should read: ±24 sts and 32 rows = 4" / 10cm
